AN ACT

1 Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699),
2 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice
3 of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of
4 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising,
5 consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto,"
6 providing for nonresident pharmacies.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961
10 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by
11 adding a clause to read:

12 Section 2. Definitions.--As used in this act:

13 * * *

14 (19) "Nonresident pharmacy" means any pharmacy located
15 outside this Commonwealth that ships, mails or delivers, in any
16 manner, legend devices or legend drugs into this Commonwealth
17 pursuant to a prescription order.

18 Section 2. Section 4 of the act is amended by adding a
19 subsection to read:

1 Section 4. Permit to Conduct a Pharmacy.--* * *

2 (k) A pharmacy that is also licensed, permitted or
3 registered by the proper licensing authority of another state to
4 ship, mail or deliver legend devices or legend drugs to patients
5 in that state shall report this information to the board on the
6 biennial registration. Any disciplinary action taken in other
7 states shall be reported to the board within thirty days of
8 final disposition. A nonresident license, permit or registration
9 shall be noted by the board on the pharmacy's record, and the
10 state shall be notified by the board of any disciplinary action
11 taken against the pharmacy in this Commonwealth.

12 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

13 Section 4.1. Nonresident Pharmacies.--(a) A nonresident
14 pharmacy shall register on a biennial basis with the board and
15 obtain a certificate of registration to conduct a pharmacy in
16 accordance with this section. The nonresident pharmacy shall:

17 (1) Disclose on the initial and renewal registration
18 applications the location, names and titles of all principal
19 corporate officers, if applicable, and the pharmacist in charge.
20 A nonresident pharmacy shall report to the board within thirty
21 days after any change of location or pharmacist in charge.

22 (2) Submit a statement that the nonresident pharmacy
23 complies with all lawful directions and requests for information
24 from the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it
25 is licensed as well as complies with all requests for
26 information made by the board pursuant to this section.

27 (3) Maintain at all times, a valid unexpired license, permit
28 or registration to conduct the pharmacy in compliance with the
29 laws of the state in which the nonresident pharmacy is located.

30 (4) Before receiving a certificate of registration from the

1 board, submit a copy of the most recent inspection report
2 resulting from an inspection conducted by the regulatory or
3 licensing agency of the state in which the nonresident pharmacy
4 is located or by the National Association of Boards of
5 Pharmacy's Verified Pharmacy Program.

6 (b) A nonresident pharmacy shall, during its regular hours
7 of operation, but not less than six days per week, and for a
8 minimum of forty hours per week, provide a toll-free telephone
9 number to facilitate communication between patients in this
10 Commonwealth and a pharmacist who is licensed in this
11 Commonwealth or in the state in which the nonresident pharmacy
12 is located and who has access to the patient's records. The
13 toll-free telephone number shall be disclosed on a label affixed
14 to each container of drugs dispensed to patients in this
15 Commonwealth.

16 (c) A nonresident pharmacy shall report to the board within
17 thirty days of final disposition any disciplinary action taken
18 by the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which the
19 nonresident pharmacy is located.

20 (d) A nonresident pharmacy may not engage in the business of
21 shipping, mailing or delivering legend devices or legend drugs
22 in this Commonwealth unless the nonresident pharmacy has been
23 issued a certificate of registration by the board and has paid
24 the fee established by the board by regulation for issuance or
25 renewal of the certificate of registration. Applications for a
26 certificate of registration or renewal as a nonresident pharmacy
27 shall be made on a form furnished by the board. The board may
28 require the information it deems reasonably necessary to carry
29 out the purpose of this section.

30 (e) The board may deny, revoke or suspend any certificate of

1 registration as a nonresident pharmacy for failure to comply
2 with any requirement of this section.

3 (f) The board may deny, revoke or suspend any certificate of
4 registration as a nonresident pharmacy for conduct which causes
5 serious bodily injury or serious psychological injury to a
6 resident of this Commonwealth provided that the board has
7 referred the matter to the regulatory or licensing agency in the
8 state in which the nonresident pharmacy is located.

9 (g) The board may deny, revoke or suspend any certificate of
10 registration as a nonresident pharmacy upon proof satisfactory
11 to the board that the nonresident pharmacy's permit to conduct a
12 pharmacy was suspended or revoked or the nonresident pharmacy
13 was otherwise disciplined by the proper licensing authority of
14 another state.

15 (h) It shall be unlawful for a nonresident pharmacy that has
16 not been issued a certificate of registration pursuant to this
17 section to advertise its services in this Commonwealth, or for a
18 person who is a resident of this Commonwealth to advertise the
19 pharmacy services of a nonresident pharmacy that has not
20 received a certificate of registration from the board, with the
21 knowledge that the advertisement will or is likely to induce
22 members of the public in this Commonwealth to use the pharmacy
23 for dispensing prescriptions.

24 Section 4. Section 5(b) of the act is amended by adding a
25 clause to read:

26 Section 5. Refusal to Grant, Revocation and Suspension.--* *
27 *

28 (b) The board shall have the power to refuse, revoke or
29 suspend the permit of any pharmacy upon proof satisfactory to it
30 that:

1 * * *

2 (7) The pharmacy's license, permit or registration to
3 conduct a pharmacy or a nonresident pharmacy issued by the
4 proper licensing authority of another state has been revoked or
5 suspended or the pharmacy was otherwise disciplined.

6 * * *

7 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
